VII. Legislation

1. Ordinance 2016-2, Amend Zoning Code to Clarify the Definition of "Addition", on first reading.

Specifically defines addition as any new construction that increases volume. Bogle stated that adding a dormer would then increase volume or square footage. The additional volume would then have to be cleared to make sure that there is no overage. Murphy stated that the ordinance translates that the addition of a dormer would increase volume. If the volume is above the permitted amount, then it becomes an addition. The ordinance was deferred for modification to clarify the addition of dormers.

- 2. Ordinance 2016-4, Close, Vacate, and Abandon a Portion of the Right of Way of a 50' Street Called Redwing Avenue at the Rear of 121 Westhampton Pl and 400 Sunnyside Drive, on second reading.
 - Ordinance was approved with clarification needed as to whether the width of the street is 40^{\prime} or 50^{\prime} . A motion was made to pass the ordinance on second reading upon clarification of the width of the street.

3. Ordinance 2016-5, Fix Tax Rate for Fiscal Year 2106-2017, on first reading.

The current rate of .2243 per \$100 of assessed value was passed on first reading. The City will host a series of public hearings to determine how to compensate for the loss of the Hall Tax over the next five years.

Discussion-

Thornburg stated that with the loss of the Hall Tax, the City will lose at least 10% of its income for the budget per year for the next 5 years until it's gone completely. The goal of the public hearings is to educate the public so that they are aware of the ramifications of the elimination of the Hall Tax. It means that the City will need to increase the property taxes simultaneous with the decrease of the budget.
