3. Request to Purchase (2) Police Vehicles -

One marked patrol unit and one un-marked detective vehicle are due for replacement. The requested vehicle for the un-marked detective is the Ford Interceptor Utility, priced at \$27,421 from Ford of Murfreesboro, off the TN State-Wide Contract. Sealed bids were obtained for a 2015 Volkswagen Passat. Bidders were:

Hallmark of Rivergate \$25,875 Landers Ford of Colliersville \$28,153

Chief recommends purchasing the patrol unit from the low bidder, Hallmark.

4. Request to Purchase Vehicle Emergency Equipment -

Three quotes were obtained for emergency equipment for the new marked patrol unit:

On-Duty Depot \$3,804 * Comserv of Memphis \$3,950 * Truckers Lighthouse \$4,173

Three quotes were obtained for installation of the needed equipment:

Comserv of Memphis $\frac{\$1,317.50}{}$ * Blue Lightning $\frac{\$1,140}{}$ * Truckers Lighthouse $\frac{\$990}{}$

Chief recommends the low estimate from On-Duty Depot for the equipment purchase and Blue Lightning for the installation. Blue Lightning has installed the equipment on the other Passat patrol units and they do high quality work.

5. Request to Purchase GPS Tracking Equipment for Police and Public Works vehicles

Benefits for using a GPS tracking system on all city vehicles are safety, monitoring vehicle locations at any time, detect bad driving behavior, dispatching closet unit to location of a police call, defend employees from erroneous complaints of bad driving behavior, and reduction of idle time. Two quotes were obtained for 16 police vehicles and two public work units:

Verizon: Equipment $\frac{$2,034}{$338}$ Connectivity/Service $\frac{$4,093.20}{$5,702.40}$ =\$6,127.20 =\$6,040.40

Chief reviewed both vendor's systems, and recommends Verizon since their monthly per unit is less expensive (\$18.95 per unit per month compared to Sprint at \$26.40 per unit per month). Chief applied for a 2015-2016 TML Safety Partners Matching Driver Safety Grant, and if received, the City would be reimbursed up to 50% of the cost of the driver safety related approved item.
