

ORDINANCE NO. 67-1

AN ORDINANCE TO CLOSE, VACATE AND ABANDON A PORTION OF A CERTAIN UNOPENED RIGHT-OF-WAY, SHOWN ON THE MAJOR STREET PLAN OF THE CITY OF BELLE MEADE, AND DESIGNATED AS DERBY STREET: AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY RECORDER TO CERTIFY SAME FOR RECORDING IN THE REGISTER'S OFFICE OF DAVIDSON COUNTY, TENNESSEE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLE MEADE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. THAT, WHEREAS, the major street plan of the City of Belle Meade, heretofore, on May 10, 1946, recorded in the Register's Office of Davidson County, Tennessee, shows among others, a certain unopened and paved right-of-way designated as Derby Street which had its northerly terminus at its intersection with Lynwood Terrace, an existing street, and its southerly terminus at its intersection with Redwing Avenue, also unopened and unpaved, and intersecting about midway in its course another unopened right-of-way designated as Gardner Drive; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Planning Commission of the City of Belle Meade, approved, after public hearing, a plan for subdivision of certain property adjacent to said Derby Street, and the owners of property adjoining same, or their representatives, present at said public hearing, agreed, and so stated in writing, that a portion of said Derby Street should be closed;

NOW, THEREFORE, that certain portion of an unopened, unpaved right of way shown on the major street plan of the City of Belle Meade and designated as Derby Street, extending westerly from its terminus at Lynwood Terrace to its junction with the easterly side or margin of a newly approved street known as West Hampton Place, lying in approximately the same location as a former unopened street designated as Gardner Drive, be, and the same is hereby declared closed, vacated and abandoned

SECTION 2. The City Recorder of the City of Belle Meade is hereby authorized and directed to cause a copy of this ordinance to be certified and the seal of the City affixed thereto, and recorded in the Register's

Office of Davidson County, Tennessee.
