Resolution 1940-04

When the City of Belle Meade was incorporated in 1938, Alec B. Stevenson was elected as one of the three City Commissioners who were charged with the duty of organizing the city government and carrying it on for the first two years of its existence. At the first meeting of the newly elected Board

Board of Commissioners, he was chosen as Vice-Mayor and served in this capacity during the first two years of the history of the City. In accordance with his own wish, as expressed to his colleagues on the City Commission and to other friends residing in the City of Belle Meade, he was not placed in nomination at the City Election of 1940, and consequently, his term of office expired on December 24, 1940.

During these first years of the existence of the City of Belle Meade, he has been ready at all times to sacrifice his personal convenience in order to promote the welfare of the City and its inhabitants. Because of his great ability, his thorough knowledge of the principles of municipal government and finance, and his cheerful willingness at all times to do what needed to be done, he has been of the greatest assistance to the rest of us who have served in the official family of the City. We claim the privilege of expressing our admiration of Alec. B. Stevenson as a citizen, and as an official of the City of Belle Meade.
