

Resolution 1941-02

RE: PETITION OF ROSE OLSHINE

The Petition of Rose Olshine, asking that Ordinance #9 of the City of Belle Meade be amended, was considered by the Board of Commissioners at the meeting, held March 17, 1941. The Petition, newspaper advertisement and notices by letters to neighboring property owners were read, and statements and suggestions were made by numerous property owners and others who were present. After the hearing further consideration of the Petition was postponed until the meeting to be held March 25th, 1941, in order to permit the Petitioner and others to submit additional statements and suggestions. At this second meeting, additional statements and suggestions were submitted.

From all of which, the Board of Commissioners is of the opinion:

First: That the Petition is properly drawn and filed under the provisions of Section 10 of Ordinance #9 of the City of Belle Meade.


Second: That all advertisements and notices required by Section 10 of Ordinance #9 have been published and given.

Third: That the adoption of the amendment sought in said petition would not be in harmony with the general purpose ~~and~~ intent of Ordinance #9, and would not be in the interest of public health, safety, comfort, convenience, prosperity and general welfare.

Fourth: The Board of Commissioners is, therefore, of the opinion that the admendment, requested by the Petition, should not be adopted.




