


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
Thereupon Commissioner Mitchell presented the following resolution and moved its adoption: Whereas it appears that pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 23 the Recorder has sent the proper written notices by registered mail to taxpayers whose taxes remained due and unpaid after December 31, 1943, such notices having been sent by registered mail with return receipt requested and having been mailed prior to January 10, 1944, advising said taxpayers that unless said taxes and penalties accrued and thereafter accruing should be paid prior to the 1st day of March, 1944, suit would be filed for the purpose of collecting and enforcing payment of such taxes and penalties; and WHEREAS it appears that certain delinquent taxpayers have failed to pay said taxes and penalties by the 1st day of March, 1944, and said taxes and penalties remain due and unpaid, therefore pursuant to said Ordinance No. 23 the Recorder is directed to deliver the delinquent list showing all unpaid land taxes and penalties to Cecil Sims, Esq., City Attorney, and to cause said attorney to prepare and file suits in the Chancery or Circuit Courts of Davidson County for the collection of all delinquent land taxes and penalties thereon due to the municipality.

Said resolution was duly seconded by Commissioner Cooney, and after full discussion the vote thereon was taken and resulted as follows:
