

Resolution 1946-03

WHEREAS, the area between the two-lane highway on Belle Meade Boulevard, due to lack of proper grading and lighting, constitutes a traffic hazard as evidenced by accidents in the past, and further presents an unsightly appearance;

AND WHEREAS, Belle Meade Boulevard is the principal thoroughfare through the City of Belle Meade and the approach to Warner Park;


THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Commissioners of the City of Belle Meade that the area between the two-lane highway on Belle Meade Boulevard be and is hereby declared to be a park area of the City of Belle Meade, to promote the public health, safety and welfare.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon receipt of donations from interested citizens sufficient to defray the cost, that this area be properly graded, beautified with planting, and properly lighted. The Mayor of the City of Belle Meade is hereby authorized to appoint a Committee to plan and supervise these improvements. The City Manager or Recorder is hereby authorized to accept voluntary donations for this purpose, keep same in a separate fund, and upon order of the Mayor, disburse the proceeds of such fund for the sole purpose of paying for the cost of these improvements.

Mayor Gibson then announced the appointment of the following as a committee to supervise the making of plans in accordance with the above resolution;

Mrs. T.H. Malone, Chairman, Mrs. Edwin Craig, Mrs. Donald Southgate, Mrs. Robert Webster, members and Mr. F. B. Warfield, member ex officio.

There being no further business, the meeting was then adjourned.
