

Resolution 1946-04

"Whereas, when the City of Belle Meade was incorporated in 1938, Robert G. Cooney was elected as one of the three City Commissioners who were charged with the duty of organizing the city government and carrying it on for the first two years of its existence; and

Whereas, during all the years of the existence of the City of Belle Meade he has served on the Board of Commissioners and has been ready at all times to sacrifice his personal convenience in order to promote the welfare of the city and its inhabitants, and has served the city as Mayor during the darkest years of the late World War II, from 1942 to 1944, with great distinction; and


Whereas, by virtue of his great ability, his thorough knowledge of the principles of municipal government and finance and his cheerful willingness to serve his fellow man he has endeared himself to all the citizens of Belle Meade and its officials;


NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, that our appreciation of his service, and our admiration for Robert G. Cooney, as a citizen and as an official of the City of Belle Meade, be expressed to him.
