many people regarding the present thirty miles an hour speed limit on Chickering Lane and on Tyne Boulevard, and that he had observed, as Judge of the City Recorders Court hearing traffic cases, that there were a considerable number of speed limit violations on both streets, most violations being found guilty of driving 40-50 m.p.h. in the 30-mile zone. He recommended that the Board consider a resolution, provided under Ordinance 59- , raising the speed limit on Chickering Road and Tyne Boulevard to 40 m.p.h. and directing the posting of appropriate signs. After discussion, upon motion of Vice Mayor Teas, seconded by Commissioner Smith and voted upon the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED, That the speed limit for motor vehicles on Chickering Road in the City of Belle Meade be increased from thirty (30) miles per hour to forty (40) miles per hour, and the City Manager is directed to have signs

indicating the speed limit posted upon the said street in such number and location as to give adequate notice to drivers of motor vehicles.
