## Resolution 1962-02

"WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 62-1 adopted upon Third Reading by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Belle Meade on April 6, 1962, certain standards were established for the construction of roads and streets proposed to be accepted and maintained by the City of Belle Meade; and

WHEREAS, by said ordinance the said Board of Commissioners was authorized by resolution to accept certain streets for maintenance as were found to have been properly constructed for such acceptance and approval by a duly designated inspector of the City of Belle Meade; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is advised that the following have been constructed in accordance with the said standards established by Ordinance No. 62-1, aforesaid:

- (a) Georgian Place, a cul-de-sac or dead-end street, in the subdivision of the property of George T. Hicks and James Gillespie, approximately 850 feet in length, with its southerly terminus on Herbert Place, which extends from Chickering Road to Chancery Lane, south; and
- (b) The southerly one hundred twenty (120) feet of Chickering Lane, extending from the end of that portion of the Lane previously paved to the southerly boundary of the City of Belle Meade.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the streets hereinabove described are accepted as streets of the City of Belle Meade, for control, maintenance and repair from and after this date
