the Mayor then further commented that although he had been be the Davidson County School Board and had explained to them the reasons which the City opposed to the construction of such a school at the pla indicated by the County as approved by them that his reasons had not b favorably received and the newspaper accounts had indicated that the D son County School Board planned to go ahead with their proposed school building. Thereupon, after discussion, the following motion was adopt

and voted **BE IT UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED**, that the proposed action of the Davidson County Board of Education to erect a school within the limits of the City of Belle Meade without making application for a building permit therefor, and without obtaining approval of the duly constituted authorities of the City threatens an imminent violation of the Zoning and Sanitary Ordinances of the City; and

**BE IT FURTHER UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED**, that Morton B. Howell, Jr as City Attorney, and Louis Farrell, Jr., as Special Counsel for the City, be, and they are hereby expressly authorized to prepare and institute such legal action as they may deem appropriate under the circumstances to prevent such violation of the City ordinances; and

**BE IT FURTHER UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED**, that the Mayor, Jo Gibson and the City Manager, W. T. Mallison, be and they are hereby

authorized and directed to execute any and all such pleadings and other instruments as may be necessary to make effective the purposes of this resolution.
