

ORDINANCE NO. 54-3

"AN ORDINANCE TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN ROADS AND STREETS, AND HIGHWAYS AS ARTERIAL HIGHWAYS AND TO PROVIDE FOR ERECTION OF TRAFFIC MARKERS AT INTERSECTIONS THEREOF, AND TO PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

"BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLE MEADE AS FOLLOWS:

- "SECTION 1. The roads, streets and highways named below lying within the limits of the City of Belle Meade shall be and are designated as arterial highways or through streets, and all traffic on them in the City of Belle Meade shall have precedence and right-of-way over traffic on roads, streets or highways intersecting same, as follows:
- a. Harding Road, being Tennessee Highway No. 1 and United States Highway 70, shall have right-of-way over all streets, roads and highways intersecting same within the City of Belle Meade.
 - b. Belle Meade Boulevard, the double drive, shall have right-of-way at all intersections except at Harding Road.
 - c. Harding Place, from the easterly limits to the westerly limits of the City shall have right-of-way at all intersections except at Belle Meade Boulevard and at Harding Road.
 - d. Jackson Boulevard shall have right-of-way except at its intersections with Harding Road, Belle Meade Boulevard, and Harding Place.
 - e. Lynnwood Boulevard shall have right-of-way except at its intersections with Harding Road, Lynnwood Terrace, at both termini thereof, and Harding Place. Lynnwood Terrace shall have right-of-way throughout its length.
 - f. Leake Avenue shall have right-of-way over all streets intersecting with it within the City of Belle Meade except Belle Meade Boulevard and Harding Road.
 - g. Westview Avenue shall have right-of-way from Lynnwood Boulevard to Tyne Lane, except at its intersections with Lynnwood Boulevard, Harding Place and Tyne Lane, and shall share precedence at its intersections with Glen Eden Drive, Warner Place and Forsythe Place.
 - h. Glen Eden Drive shall have right-of-way over Royal Oaks Drive.
 - i. Iroquois Place shall have right-of-way over Royal Oaks Place.
 - j. Bellevue Drive, East, shall have right-of-way over all intersection streets except Leake Avenue, at its southerly terminus, and Deer Park Drive, at its northerly terminus.

"SECTION 2. The precedence and right-of-way on the streets, roads and highways named above shall be suspended in the event there shall be a duly authorized traffic officer, or automatic traffic directing device, at any intersection thereof, but only for and during such time as such officer shall be on duty or such automatic device shall be in actual operation.

"SECTION 3. There shall be erected at each intersection of the roads, streets and highways named above with any other road, street or highway within the City of Belle Meade, a sign or marker of type approved by the Tennessee Highway Department to indicate that a stop is required; and in those instances where right-of-way and precedence is shared with another road, street or highway within the City of Belle Meade, such signs or markers shall be erected at each entrance to the intersection of same, so that traffic approaching from either direction shall be required to stop.

"SECTION 4. Every vehicle of every type shall be brought to a full and complete stop before entering any road, street or highway designated as an arterial highway or through street hereinabove, and failure so to stop shall be deemed reckless driving, and each person found guilty of such reckless driving shall be fined not less than Two (\$2.00) nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars.

"SECTION 5. In any instance in which traffic approaching an intersection from either direction is required to stop, because precedence at such intersection is shared with another street, the vehicle first arriving at such intersection, and first making a complete stop, shall then have right-of-way first to proceed.

"SECTION 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are declared repealed."
