

RESOLUTION 2001-02

WHEREAS;

1. Section 15-301 of the Municipal Code of the City of Belle Meade provides in part that "it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive a motor vehicle upon any highway, street or public way in the City of Belle Meade at a rate of speed in excess of 30 miles per hour, except where official signs authorized by the Board of Commissioners have been posted indicating other speed limits . . .";

2. The Board of Commissioners have previously authorized a speed limit of 40 miles per hour for automobiles and 20 miles per hour for trucks on Belle Meade Boulevard.

3. After careful consideration it has been determined that for the safety of the public the speed limit on Belle Meade Boulevard should be reduced to 35 miles per hour for automobiles and retained at 20 miles per hour for trucks.

4. In addition, after a reasonable trial period, and in view of the closing of the intersection of Warner Place and Jackson Boulevard, the Commissioners have determined that the speed limit on Warner Place and Forsythe Avenue should be reduced from 30 miles per hour to 25 miles per hour.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Belle Meade, as follows:


Item 1. That the speed limit for all motor vehicles, excepting trucks, for the entire length of Belle Meade Boulevard, from Harding Road to Percy Warner Park, be and the same hereby is reduced to 35 miles per hour. The speed limit for all trucks traveling on Belle Meade Boulevard shall continue to be 20 miles per hour.

Item 2. That the speed limit for all motor vehicles traveling on Warner Place and Forsythe Avenue be, and the same hereby is, reduced to 25 miles per hour.


Item 3. That appropriate signs be placed upon Belle Meade Boulevard, Warner Place and Forsythe Avenue showing these reduced speed limits.

Item 4. This resolution shall take effect 30 days after its passage, the public welfare of the City of Belle Meade requiring it.
