2. Request for Parade Permit-Ragnar Relay.

3. Award Contract-Stormwater Infrastructure Improvements.

Four estimates were received for the Infrastructure improvements

Public Works director Larry Smith and City Manager Beth Reardon concur with the engineering consultant's recommendation to award the contract to the lowest bidder, Smith Landscaping & Excavating in the amount of \$55,500.00

4. Award Contract- Electrical Services for Video Surveillance. Nine electrical contractors were contacted for this project by Director Smith, but only one submitted a bid. Kerr Electric Inc. bid \$46,333.51 for the 17 utility poles. Public Works Director Larry Smith and City Manager Beth Reardon recommend awarding the contract to Kerr Electric, based on their pricing being comparable to previous bids and their past experience working with NES.

5. Approval of Payment to TDOT - Hillwood Bridge Rehabilitation-Estimated Construction Costs.

The City of Belle Meade's share of the estimated construction cost of \$1,149,000.00 is \$45,960.00. Bids will be awarded this spring and the project will most likely take a year to complete.

6. Consideration to lower speed limits throughout the City.

Commissioner Thornburg explained she wants to make the streets safer and discourage cut-through traffic. She recommends reducing the speed limit to 25 mph on all streets, except Belle Meade Blvd. and Chickering Road, which would be reduced to 30 mph. Attorney Doug Berry says this will need to be done through an Ordinance, but today's vote will show interest and intention. City Manager Reardon noted that many of the speed limit signs just purchased several years ago would have to be replaced with new ones.

Chief Eads presented information about the cloud-based software program called PowerDMS to assist with getting the department accredited. The initial cost for the software, Tennessee module, and annual support is \$4,100. Recurring annual fees will be \$2,100. Lt. Higgins and Sgt. Carter are assigned to the program and are responsible for drafting the required standards, submitting them for approval and training the officers. Commissioner Thornburg asked if we needed to be accredited. Chief Eads says yes, it is encouraged by the state, it standardizes all training and will reduce our liability insurance costs. There are 58 departments accredited in Tennessee and we are slightly more than halfway done with the required standards. Mayor Hunt agreed that accreditation

is important; however, he would like to meet with Chief and talk more about the process and timeline for completion.
