

ORDINANCE NO. 58-2

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ACCEPTANCE
OF A PORTION OF A CERTAIN STREET DESIGNATED AS
CHICKERING LANE, AND PROVIDING FOR ITS MAINTENANCE.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 57-1, adopted on Third Reading by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Belle Meade on May 17, 1957, the terminal 50 feet of a certain street known and designated on the street plan of the City of Belle Meade was declared closed, vacated and abandoned; and


WHEREAS, there remains a right-of-way approximately seventy (70) feet in length between the end of the paved or hard surface portion of Chickering Lane and the terminus of said right-of-way which is not hard-surfaced, but is nevertheless adequately built with a well-packed base of large stones, and covered with a surface of creek gravel so as to serve as the terminal portion of said lane; and


WHEREAS, said terminal portion of the right-of-way is fitting and proper to maintain a residential character and use of roads in the City, and is not designed or planned to carry through traffic;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLE MEADE as follows:


SECTION 1. That certain portion of Chickering Lane in the City of Belle Meade lying between the end of the presently paved hard-surfaced portion of said Lane and the terminus thereof, and being approximately seventy (70) feet in length, and being covered with creek gravel, and approximately eighteen (18) feet in width, be and is hereby accepted and approved as a street by the City.

SECTION 2. That certain portion of Chickering Lane in the City of Belle Meade, lying between the end of the paved portion of said Lane, and the terminus thereof shall henceforth be maintained for the public use by application of a creek gravel or brown gravel surface, and such additions of rock and similar material to the base as may be required, any other ordinances or resolution of the City to the contrary notwithstanding.
