

ORDINANCE NO. 59-11

AN ORDINANCE TO DEFINE THE OFFENSE OF 'DISORDERLY CONDUCT' AND TO MAKE THE COMMISSION OF SAME A MISDEMEANOR; AND PRESCRIBING THE PENALTIES THEREFOR.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF BELLE MEADE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. It is hereby defined as "disorderly conduct" and it shall be unlawful for any person within the City to disturb the peace of others by violent, tumultuous, offensive, or obstreperous conduct or carriage; or by loud and unusual noises; or by unseemly, profane, obscene or offensive language, conduct or gesture; or by language, conduct or gesture calculated to provoke a breach of the peace; or, by assaulting, striking or fighting another; or by the doing of any act or thing likely, calculated or intended to provoke, or to incite others to engage in riotous, violate or disorderly conduct, or to wrongfully injure or destroy the property of another, or to threaten with bodily harm, intimidate by any means, or terrorize another in the pursuit of his lawful rights, business or occupation; or, to engage in any assembly, marching or demonstration upon any of the streets or public ways within the City for the purpose of design of provoking a breach of the peace, or inciting disorder, tumult or riot; or to intimidate any person in the pursuit of his lawful rights, business or occupation; or, to coerce, intimidate or threaten any public officer or public official, or to create public alarm or terror, or threaten the life and property of others.


SECTION 2. Any person who shall permit any person to engage in any conduct enumerated and prohibited in this section in or upon any house or premises owned or possessed by him, or under his management or control, so that others in said house or premises or in the vicinity thereof are disturbed thereby, shall likewise be deemed guilty of disorderly conduct.

SECTION 3. Any person who shall be convicted of violation of this ordinance shall be fined not less than Two (\$2.00) Dollars nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars for each offense.
