II. Public Comment

Metro Council Member Thom Druffel gave an update on Metro Council activities. Currently they are discussing the Home Business Bill that is outside the City. This bill will not affect the City of Belle Meade.

- IV. Public Works Reports submitted by L. Smith reviewed.
- 2. Proposal from Barge Cauthen and Associates for civil engineering services for the annual street resurfacing project reviewed. The proposed total amount is \$16,500.00.

The City plans to pave Chancery Lane (North and South), Honeywood Drive and Lynwood Boulevard (behind Lynwood Terrace)this year. Barge Cauthen estimates the cost of the project to be \$307,175.00. The amount of \$253,191.00 will be covered by the MOU with Metro Nashville for Roadway Maintenance this fiscal year. City Manager, Beth Reardon and Public Works Director, Larry Smith recommend the proposal of \$16,500.00 for civil engineering services from Barge Cauthen and Associates.

Once the decision is made, she will confirm with Beth Reardon the status of the Bolt.

Commissioner, Louise Bryan, addressed City Attorney, Doug Berry, asking if there should be some Covid 19 language added to the existing City of Belle Meade Parade Permit?

Berry responded that Cities do not have any liability for permitting events. Reardon added in order to receive a Parade Permit an application has to be formally addressed to the Board of Commissioners for approval. A Solicitors Permit is granted by the City Manager.

4. Proposal from Barge Cauthen and Associates Civil Engineers for City Wide Streets Condition Inventory and Maintenance Schedule. The proposed amount is \$29,500.00.

City Manager, Beth Reardon, commented that the first inventory was completed by Barge Cauthen and Associates Fall of 2013.

5. Update on Belle Meade Boulevard Street Light Replacement City Manager, Beth Reardon, stated that the Mayor has signed the letter to NES giving them permission to purchase the fixtures. NES is required to get three bids. NES will purchase and stock the fixtures for the City of Belle Meade. At that time, they will then compute what the upfront cost will be or the cost over the 18.2 years that TVA requires. The Commission will decide what method of payment they would like to use.
