3. Engineering Estimate for Traffic Study - Tyne at BMB

As a result of the citizens concern of the danger of the intersection of Tyne Boulevard and Belle Meade Boulevard City Manager Beth Reardon and Public Works Director Larry Smith met with traffic engineers KCI Technologies at the intersection to discuss the sight distance issues. KCI Technologies submitted a proposal recommending a scope of work to include three Tasks.

- Task 1 Sight Distance Analysis and Documentation \$2,800.00
- Task 2 All-Way Stop Warrant Study \$4,500.00
- Task 3 Project Coordination and Management \$2,700.00

City Manager Beth Reardon recommends Task 1, the Sight Distance Analysis, be performed by KCI Technologies. This study will also help to determine the relocation of the stop bar on Tyne. The commissioners also asked that traffic counts be conducted at this intersection of Tyne and Belle Meade Blvd., using the City's equipment, but after all schools are in session.

Ericka Doldran with Belle Meade Historic Site and Winery gave an update on the current status of the Belle Meade Historic Site. Today they are at 92% of pre-covid levels of paid attendance. They have adopted a fiscally conservative attitude and an aggressive maintenance and programming stance for the future. They see a strong attendance and increased restaurant and tasting experiences traffic. The Historic Site again won accolades during the Pandemic, including "Best Place to get Married in Nashville" and "Top Venue in the South". The decision was made to not host any special events for this year. However, they are almost sold out for 2022. The Plantation continues to conduct guided tours along the grounds and hosting only small group educational programs in 2021 and will try to return to our normal school groups in 2022 should they be allowed to travel.

Belle Meade Meat and Three is open seven days a week. The new deck allows excellent social distancing outdoors and is loved by neighbors and visitors alike.
